Why do we learn Child Development?

Pupils learn about how children grow and develop from 0-5 years. The course gives pupils an insight into how factors can affect a child's development. Pupils are taught the importance of play and how adults can support children to learn, play and develop. Pupils will develop skills and knowledge needed to work with the Childcare sector.

How do we learn in Child Development?

This is an optional subject in Key Stage 4, pupils are expected to demonstrate an informed and mature attitude and understanding of the key topics. Pupils follow the Pearson BTEC Tech Award specification. They are taught a component at a time over the two years.
